Epsilon – E  $\varepsilon$  = like "eh" in bet

Zeta –  $Z \zeta$  = like "z" in zebra

Eta – H  $\eta$  = like "ee" in beet

Theta –  $\Theta \theta$  = a soft "th" like in through

Lota – I  $\iota$  = "ee" or like "i" in it

Kappa – K  $\kappa$  = like "k" or "c" in car

Lambda –  $\Lambda \lambda$  = like "l" in lemon

 $Mu - M \mu = like "m" in mother$ 

Nu - Nv = like "n" in now

Ksi –  $\Xi \xi$  = like "x" in ax

Omicron – O o = like "oh" in only

Pi – Π  $\pi$  = like "p" in puppy

Rho – P  $\rho$  = a rolled "rrr"

Sigma –  $\Sigma \sigma \varsigma$  = like "s" in see

Tau – T  $\tau$  = like "t" in top

Upsilon – Y  $\upsilon$  = "ee" again or "u" in put

Phi –  $\Phi \Phi$  = like "f" in fish

Chi – X  $\chi$  = a gargly "h"

Psi –  $\Psi \psi$  = a "ps" sound like in chips

Omega –  $\Omega$   $\omega$  = and "oh" or "awe" sound
